## Welcome aboard to Greg James

Multi-media boating and fishing writer, Greg James, will be our special guest at Yorke Peninsula's Saltwater Classic this coming weekend (April 9 and 10).

Greg, who is regularly heard on ABC Adelaide and regional radio and is the boating and fishing writer for the Yorke Peninsula Country Times, will join Master of Ceremonies, Grant Carter, on the microphone in Stansbury on Saturday and in Port Vincent on Sunday.

While Greg knows all there is to know about modern boats, he is also an "old hand" at classic boats having worked as a deckie for a professional fisherman aboard a 21-foot carvel wooden hull boat called the *Edna Felice*.

"We fished from Murat Bay over 30 years ago and I remember the *Edna Felice* had a wet well to keep the fish alive and she was powered by a 2hp diesel motor along with sloop-rigged sails," Greg said.

"She had tiller steering and was pretty slow, but we caught heaps of fish. I believe the *Edna Felice* is now resting at the Axel Stenross Museum in Port Lincoln."

Greg says he is delighted to be part of Yorke Peninsula's Saltwater Classic.

"Modern day events like the Saltwater Classic create a wonderful connection with our maritime heritage," he said.
